REGULATIONS

Baltic Herring Short Film Competition is intended for the filmmakers in the Baltic Sea countries: Finland, Russia, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Germany, Denmark, Norway and Sweden.

Films offered for the competition should have a maritime or aqua theme.

Three competition categories:

Non-professional filmmakers

- open for amateur filmmakers

Professional filmmakers

- open for professional filmmakers

Student filmmakers

- open for students of film/ media schools

One film may compete only in one category.

Maximum duration of the film is 30 minutes.

There are no limitations to the original format of the film.

English subtitles or a synopsis of the film in English is required.

The filmmakers are responsible for the recording permissions and reimbursements of the possible copyright protected material in the film content.

Films selected into the competition will be announced on Blue Sea Film Festival site <http://www.blueseafilmfestival.net/x/> on August 5, 2019.

If your film will be selected to the Baltic Herring competition...

- festival organisers will contact the filmmakers of the selected films
- we will need a.s.a.p. your film with English subtitles for the festival screening compilations

The short films selected into the competition will be screened for the international jury and the festival audience on the 26th Blue Sea Film Festival on August 22–25, 2019, in Rauma, Finland.

The International Jury will award the best short films with money prizes.

The very best short film of the competition will also win the Golden Baltic Herring Award, a ceramic sculpture designed by Kaarina Selin. The former winners have named it as the “Baltic Herring Oscar”.

Also the festival audience has a chance to vote for their favourite and win film-related prizes.

The International Jury of the Baltic Herring Short Film Competition 2019 will be announced later on this page.
